Highlights:

On Saturday, March 23rd between the hours of 2:00 a.m. and 5:00 a.m. I worked on a special detail with police officers working morning watch for the purpose of inspecting every alcohol beverage location. Our visits and inspections was to make certain the closing hours and provisions were being adhered to and to offer continued education to the business owners regarding the alcohol ordinance. Three (3) court summons were issued to a business owner for the May 7th court appearance for serving alcohol after hours; not adequate level of interior lighting and having patrons in business after hours as a result of this detail.

On Friday, March 29th I attended a planning and review meeting with City Manager; Finance Officer and City Clerk regarding session #3 of Clarkston 101 program scheduled for Thursday, March 18th from 6:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m.

During the month, Chief Hudson and I performed in-service training for police officers using a resource guide I created for reporting violations regarding prohibited signage; bulk trash and yard debris while on patrol. The officers are submitting written reports which reflect the officer either remedying the violation or reporting the violation to the appropriate department. Rodney Beck and I performed in-service training for Public Works employees where they are also reporting any violations regarding prohibited signage; bulk trash and yard debris observed while performing their normal day to day job functions.

Eight (8) inoperative vehicles that are on this report came from Reserve Police Officer G. Spicer who patrols all of the apartment and condominium complexes on Saturday nights. All vehicles were either removed from the city or current tags were placed onto vehicles bringing them into compliance.

Seven (7) Special Detail reports were submitted by Police Department where their officer's report to appropriate department or remedy violations observed while on patrol regarding signage; bulk trash and yard debris.
